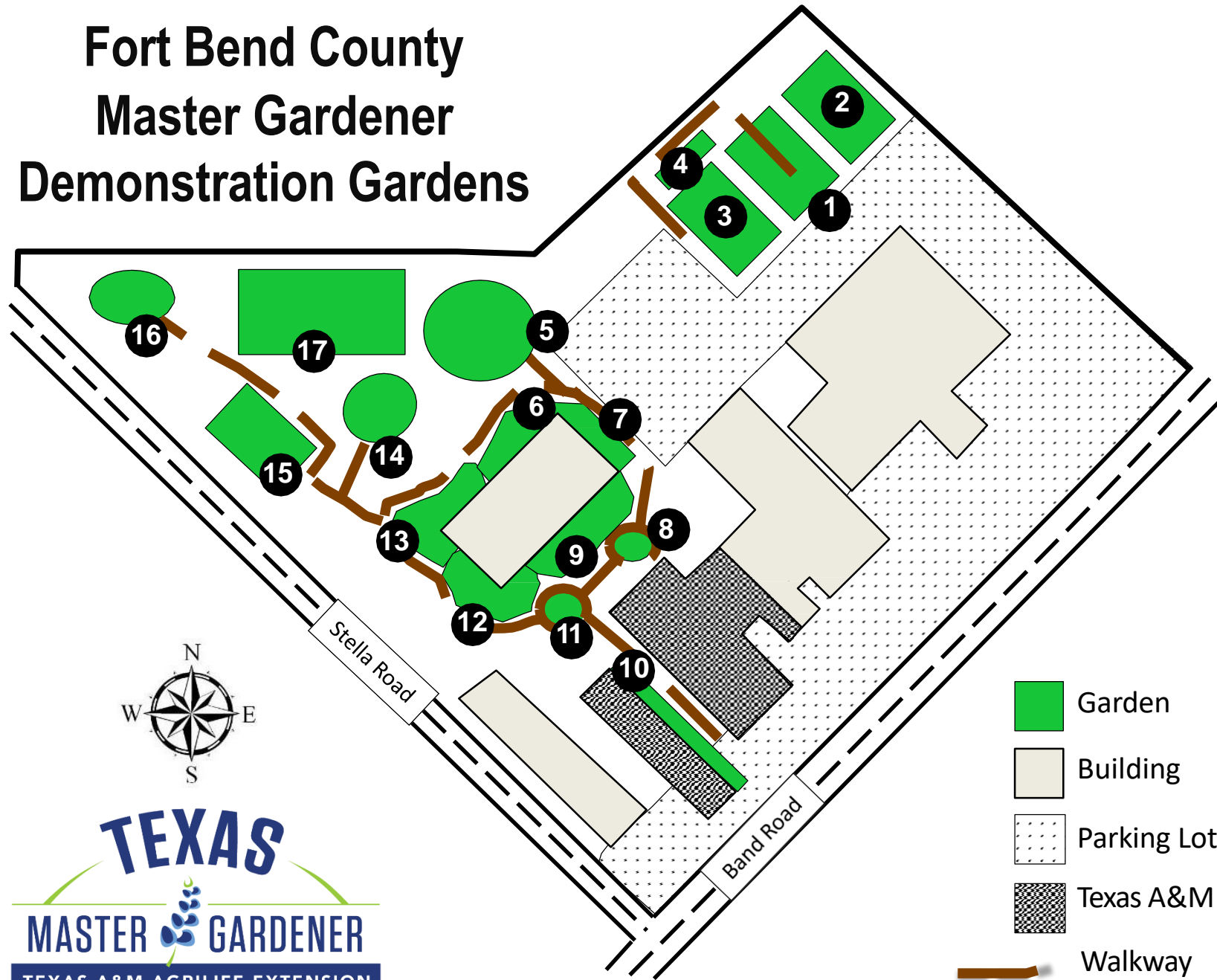



Fort Bend County Master Gardeners Demonstration Gardens

Herb Garden - Herbs that can be grown in Texas in a traditional knot shaped garden.

Grape Vineyard - Not in use.

Vegetable Garden – Vegetables grown in raised beds, containers, and rows. Produce donated to a local food bank.

Compost - Composting techniques demonstrated in a four-bin system.

Japanese Garden - Plants and hardscape elements representing earth, water, wind, and metal.

Rain Barrel - Captures water from the roof and holds it for later use in the garden.

Native Garden - Texas native plants that are beautiful and drought-resistant. Recipient of “Bring Back the Monarchs to Texas Grant Program”.

Texas Superstar® Garden – Tested and selected plants for their superstar performance in the Texas landscape.

Edible Front Yard Garden – Edible plants in a front yard setting combined with ornamental plants.

Shady Lane Garden - Pretty plants that prefer shade to partly shady conditions.

Earth-Kind® Garden - Plants that are heat tolerant, drought tolerant, pest tolerant, with minimal soil or fertility requirements.

Butterfly Garden - Pollinator and host plants that attract butterflies and other beneficial insects.

Cottage Garden - Charming, informal design, brimming with an ornamental mix of plants including many pass-along plants.

Gathering Place - Used for educational events. Landscaped using 14 ornamental grasses that we trialed for drought tolerance, insect resistance, and ease of growing.

Greenhouse - Used for propagation of plants for our gardens and fund-raising sales.

Backyard Orchard - Fruit trees and berries in a backyard setting that can be combined with ornamental plants and a grass yard.

Hardy Citrus Trial - Current trial gathering data on the cold hardiness of 12 varieties of satsuma trees.
