Have you ever wished you had an expert at hand to help with your garden and landscape questions? You do! Fort Bend County Master Gardeners (FBCMGs) are here for you. All FBCMGs are trained gardening enthusiasts who have gone through specific horticulture training. Each FBCMG must commit to a performing at least 50 volunteer hours and continuing our education each year. Master Gardeners are found throughout the United States, but this article will focus on the Fort Bend County Master Gardeners.



FBCMGs' primary mission is to educate Fort Bend County residents about horticulture with science-based information. We are here to help you. One of the ways

we do this is through our Hotline, staffed by volunteers most weekday mornings who answer your horticultural questions. Got a sick plant, an unidentified pest, or a question that's bugging you? If you need gardening inspiration or if you want to see plants that grow well in our area, visit the Fort Bend County Master Gardener Demonstration Gardens at 1402 Band Road, Rosenberg, TX. Walking through these four acres of gardens you can take a self-guided tour of our 14 different gardens. Our Demonstration Gardens are open seven days a week from daylight to dark. Have you ever bought a plant only to take it home and kill it because you didn't know how to care for it? Three times a year, FBCMGs hold special sales. In late winter, we hold the Fruit and Citrus Tree Sale (our next one will be February 8, 2020!). In spring and again in fall, we have our Vegetable and Herb Plant Sales. The proceeds from these sales help to fund our educational activities. However, the real benefit to you is not just the plants you can



purchase, but the expert guidance you can obtain from the master gardeners on hand who can answer your questions about how to plant, nurture, and harvest your fruits, vegetables, citrus, and herbs. Check out our website and social media for more information.
